Getting your promotional material and process right for your organisation

- Think about your job titles, do they really reflect the work people do?
- Enhance your approach to <u>Values Based Recruitment</u> then you attract and develop people with the right values
- Consider social media more as a route to promote your service and job opportunities -Using social media to attract potential recruits
- Use banners and images already developed for your social media https://www.everydayisdifferent.com/recruit.aspx
- Have a list of promotional activities and tick it off when used we called this "recruitment bingo"

Promote your vacancies on the free jobs boards

Consider a refer a friend scheme for your staff

Link with the work coaches in your local Job Centre Plus

- That way you will find out about Kickstart and other <u>government funded job schemes</u> Kickstart covers employment costs for 6months, plus a training grant
- Send detailed information about your jobs to the work coaches in your local Job Centre Plus
- Ask about their pre-employment schemes and any campaigns they have

Make the most of work experience / student placements and pre-employment schemes

 Contact your local college / school to ask about work experience they might need for their health and social care courses - this will support your future workforce applications.
